### **Blue-Green Algae Awareness**

#### **Concerns From Last Summer's Notifications**

On August 16, 2018, a Public Health Notice was issued for Three Mile Lake regarding the potential for a blue-green algae bloom. Unrelated to our regular water guality monitoring, a sample had been sent to the Ministry of Environment based on concerns observed on one part of the lake. Unfortunately, not even our regular monitoring of key water quality metrics helps us predict when this sort of lake event may occur. This time around, fortunately, the conditions did not lead to a full toxic bloom. This is, however, a warning we need to take very seriously. Protection of our lake is absolutely critical and anything we can do to reduce pressure on the natural environment will help us avoid serious situations. Maintaining the natural shoreline and its natural filters; eliminating use of fertilizers or pesticides which may run into the lake; leaving the natural habitats of all of our lake creatures undisturbed; ensuring that our septic systems are working as they should – all of these things will help us. Obviously, a lot of this is beyond our control, but we do have control over certain aspects. We also need to ensure that local planning by-laws continue to protect our lakes and shorelines.

Related to last year's Public Health Notice, we have raised the issue of "process problems" with the folks at Public Health, Ministry of Environment, and the Township. There is currently no closing-of-the-loop with respect to the bluegreen algae warnings which were made public. Although we never incurred a serious bloom, the warning sign was left up at the boat launch and not removed until after Thanksgiving. We want to ensure that anyone visiting our lake is aware of potential issues; however, we also want to ensure that accurate information and accurate warnings are provided. None of the agencies involved have a process to close the loop by re-testing the lake and removing the warnings. We will continue to push to get this process fixed. It should be noted that these warnings were issued for at least 15 lakes in the Parry Sound / North Bay Public Health catchment area last summer...

The maximum allowable value is 1000 cfus (colony forming units).

The *E.coli* levels were also tested twice at the same five spots in the lake. The E.coli levels were all well below the recreational water threshold of 100 cfus.

High **phosphorus** along with nitrogen can be a driver of algae blooms. Typically, one would like to have phosphorus levels below 20  $\mu$ g/L. All of our results were well below 20 $\mu$ g/L.

Many, many thanks to Arnie Pundsack and Arlene Vujacic for their roles on the TMLCC executive for many years.

**Changes / Clarifications Made to Lakefront Property Development...**two key wording changes were made at Armour Township recently to clarify that a 'bunkie' needs to be a separate structure (i.e. not part of an existing structure) and only one septic system is allowed per lakefront property. Wording on these points was not clear previously.

Flooding this past Spring in areas very close to us (Burk's Falls and Katrine) underline the new reality we are likely going to face more frequently. Most properties on Three Mile Lake were spared this time around, but flooding and wild fires are two examples of natural occurrences which are happening much more frequently. Cottagers should be aware that their insurance may not cover all damage from these occurrences and that certain government funding for damages only covers permanent residences, not cottages. Be educated on the coverage you may or may not have...and take precautions!
